Every state now requires all students to graduate college and career ready. The nation's schools must change fast to meet this high standard.

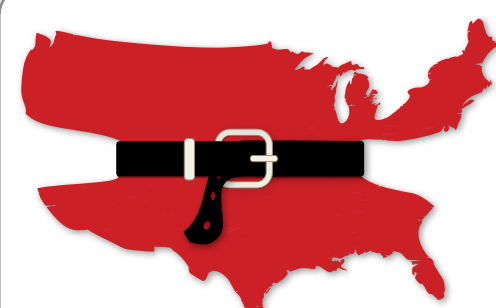

States and districts have been riding a funding roller-coaster for most of the last decade and need to find ways to do more with less funding.



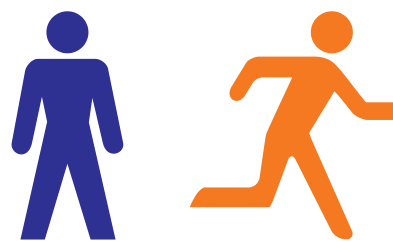
Per-student spending has declined in most states since 2008.
